INDIANA-CHINA ECONOMIC TIES

- » Indiana is home to at least 21 China-based business establishments, which support approximately 2,500 jobs across the state.
- » China is among Indiana's top five international trading partners.
- » In 2018, Indiana imported nearly \$9.3 billion worth of China-made products, making China Indiana's second-largest provider of foreign-made goods.
- » China is Indiana's fourth-largest export destination, shipping \$1.9 billion worth of Hoosier-made goods to China in 2018 – an increase of 55% since 2015.

EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL TIES

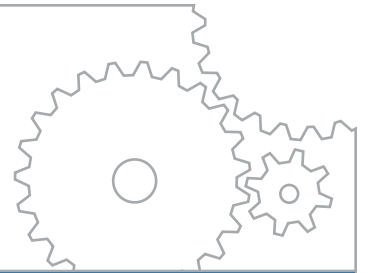
- » Indiana University, Purdue University and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology have education partnerships with Zhejiang Province while some of Indiana's other higher education institutions have established exchange programs.
- » More than 10,000 Chinese students attend universities in Indiana, including Indiana University, Purdue University and the University of Notre Dame.
- » In 2017, Indiana celebrated the 30th anniversary of its sister-state partnership with China's Zhejiang Province.
- » Additionally, 23 Indiana communities have sister-city relationships with China communities.

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

Since 2013, 12 Chinese businesses have committed to locating or growing in Indiana. Together, they plan to invest more than \$321 million in their Indiana operations and create up to 1,574 new jobs.

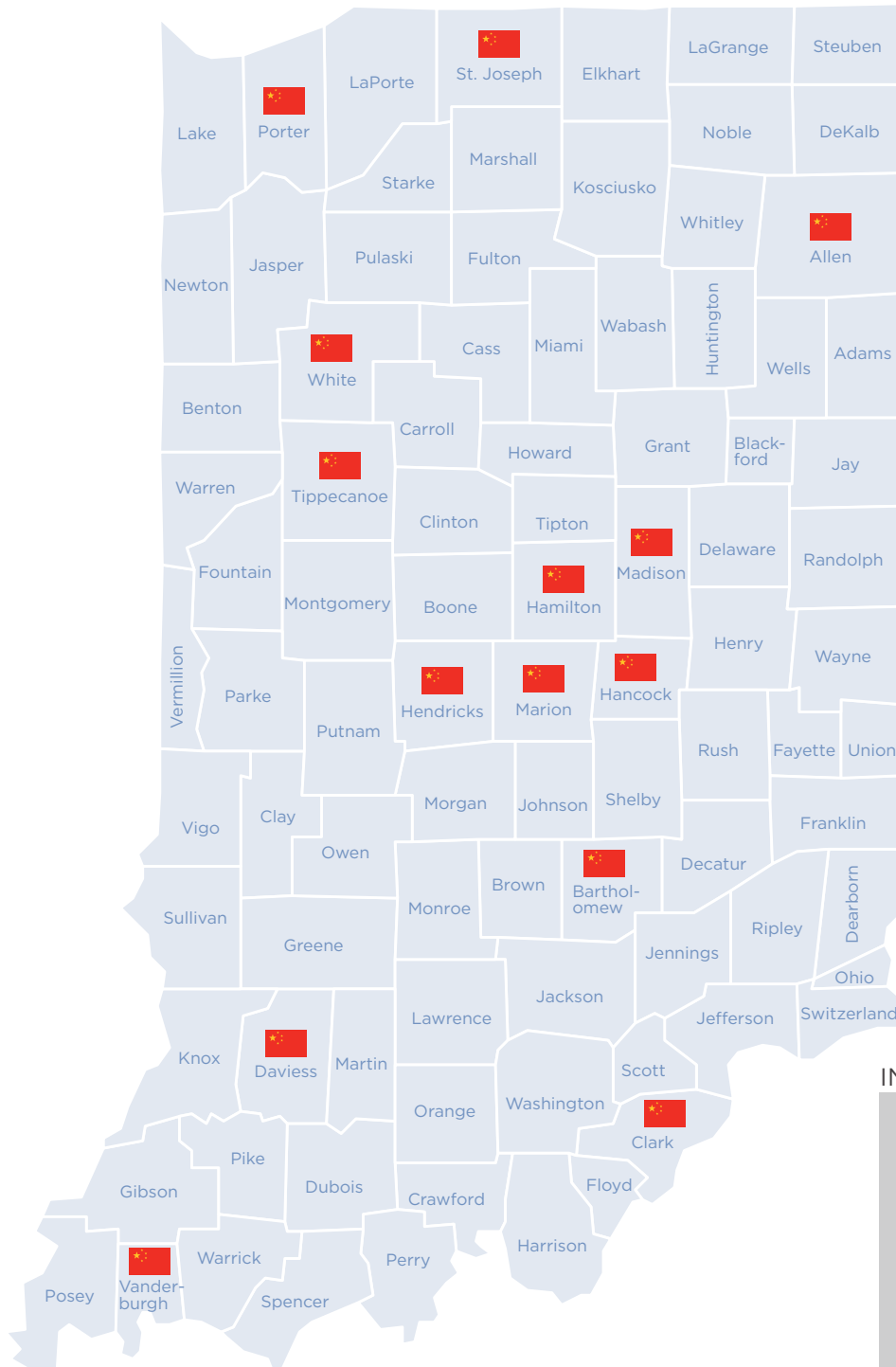
- In 2019, Indiana Wheel Corporation, a startup manufacturing company specializing in the production and distribution of steel wheels, announced plans to establish operations in Marshall County, creating up to 117 new jobs over the next few years.
- In 2018, Tian Yuan announced plans to establish a new manufacturing facility in Washington County to produce plastic resins, creating up to 35 new jobs.
- In 2017, BeijingWest Industries, Co. Ltd. (BWI), a premier chassis supplier for the automotive market, announced plans to locate its first U.S. production facility in Greenfield, creating up to 441 new, high-wage jobs by 2021. The company celebrated the grand opening of its new facility in 2019.
- In 2015, Haier America, a division of Haier Group, cut the ribbon on the company's new Technology and Design Center for Excellence in Evansville, celebrating its plans to advance research and development and create 50 new, high-wage jobs.
- Acquired by China International Marine Container (CIMC) in 2004, Vanguard National Trailer Corporation, which manufactures semi truck trailers and employs more than 500 Hoosiers, has invested more than \$10 million in its Indiana operations.



CHINA INVESTMENT IN INDIANA

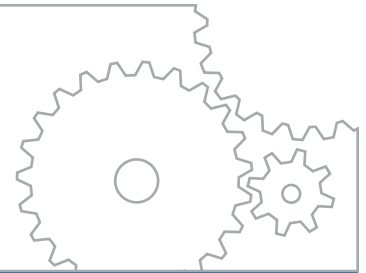
